I am happy to provide you with these updates. As your Liaison I strive to keep constituents informed and up to speed with what's going on in their respective community.

To answer some of your questions, the plot of land identified for the development is a full 800 acres but a little less than 700 should be used for the panels and fencing once the developer provides the community with a visual concept map we should have more clarity about the size of the project and the layout. Right now, PNM has not selected the project and it has been shortlisted in the recent past.

Finally, I have requested copies of the studies (archeological, cultural, wetland and Environmental Impact Studies, all separate I believe) from Rebecca Halford who is the Stakeholder Relations Manager with AES energy but they need to confirm if they can release the studies before a formal application is made to the County. There may be more findings or changes and they do not want conflicting information in community.

The developer is supposed to be having a meeting this Wednesday for the residents of the San Marcos area, one I learn about the date and time I will let you know so you can attend and ask the contractors these questions directly.

Good Morning Ms. Brom,

My name is Olivia Romo, Constituent Services Liaison with the District 5 office here at Santa Fe County. Commission Hughes asked that I provide you with an update regarding the Thompson's proposed solar project. AES Clean Energy is the contractor who is designing and overseeing the 700 acre project. The project will be fenced and stand about 7 feet tall (agricultural fencing will be used to allow wildlife to pass). The project is estimated to be about 1000 feet to the nearest home/community.

The developer has completed cultural, archeological and wetland studies to ensure no disturbances or significant sites would be impacted in the development. In addition to this, one access road will be needed specifically to the switch yard where PNM may connect to the transmission line.

The Land Use Department has confirmed that they have not formally received their application and will treat it like any other conditional use permit that will need to go before the Planning Commission and Board of County Commissioners for consideration.

Once I receive news or an update regarding the project, I will be sure to reach out to you so you are notified and can participate in the public hearings and meetings.
